The Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) is a United Nations-supported initiative founded in 2007 that aims to raise the profile of sustainability in their classrooms through Seven Principles focused on serving society and safeguarding our planet.

PRME engages business and management schools to ensure they provide future leaders with the skills needed to balance economic and sustainability goals, while drawing attention to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and aligning academic institutions with the work of the UN Global Compact. Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

Student Voices: SDG Internship Reports 1- 8

New Delhi Institute of Management's Sustainability Centre of Responsible Management and Sustainable Management has adopted an innovative strategy for embedding sustainability in teaching-learning and evaluation processes. Apart from offering a dedicated course on 'Sustainability and Social Entrepreneurship' each first year MBA student goes through an internship on one or more SDGs for experiential learning and immersive experience in a non- government/ social sector organization. This helps them gain real-time experience of how SDGs are put into practice, the challenges faced and what psycho-social impacts these initiatives create on the community and other stakeholders. Many of them feel inspired by the commitment and dedication of a leader and pursue sustainability as their area of focus for major project (a mandatory requirement) in the final year. They receive a certificate from the organization and submit a report to the organization with suggestions for improvement based on their knowledge of management education. They submit a copy of the report to the institute for evaluation aligning with teaching and learning at the institute. linking internship work on SDGs with concepts and teaching at NDIM.

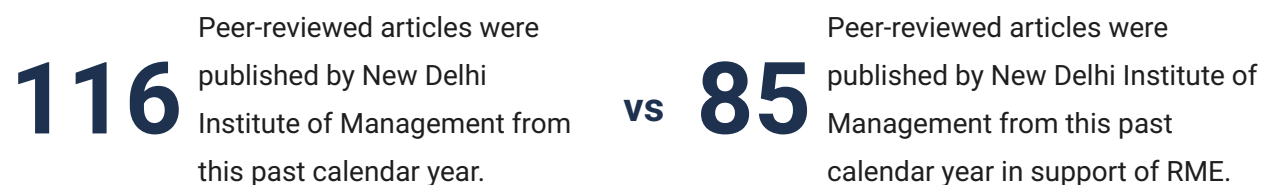
