As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

The UAS Grisons aligns its strategic priorities closely with the advancement of sustainable development, the common good and high-quality education through a holistic and integrated institutional approach.

The newly established cycle 2025-2036 follows the vision "As an agile university, we shape the future boldly and sustainably". This places particular emphasis on ensuring long-term future viability, continuing to meet the evolving needs of students, society and the economy. At its core is the strengthening of the university's key competence, that is, higher education, through innovative, demand-driven study programmes, lifelong learning, and practice-oriented research. Sustainable development is embedded as one of the five identified cross-cutting themes which make up the strategy, and is additionally guided by several SDGs, particularly SDG4 (quality education) and SDG 8 (decent work and economic growth). The UAS Grisons commits to equipping our students with the competencies to become responsible, future-oriented professionals who actively contribute to solving real-world economic, social and environmental challenges, particularly in alpine regions.

Additionally, four strategic development priorities have been identified: (1) innovation in technology and IT, (2) economic development of alpine regions through tourism, (3) integrated care in alpine regions with a focus on health, and (4) increasing attractiveness through infrastructure and new learning formats. These all support social inclusion, regional development and digital transformation, and are implemented through an inclusive, collaborative governance model that promotes excellence, diversity and open science. Across all levels such as teaching, research and partnerships, the UAS Grisons ensures the integration to sustainability, diversity and innovation. This included the expansion of interdisciplinary programmes, cooperation with regional partners through living labs, and the ongoing reflection on the impact of its educational mission.
