The Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) is a United Nationssupported initiative founded in 2007 that aims to raise the profile of sustainability in their classrooms through Seven Principles focused on serving society and safeguarding our planet.

PRME engages business and management schools to ensure they provide future leaders with the skills needed to balance economic and sustainability goals, while drawing attention to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and aligning academic institutions with the work of the UN Global Compact. Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.



The PRME initiative was launched to nurture responsible leaders of the future. Never has this task been more important. Bold leadership and innovative thinking are needed to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

At the heart of Agenda 2030 are 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and 169 related targets that address the most important economic, social, environmental and governance challenges of our time. The SDGs clearly define the world we want – applying to all nations and leaving no one behind. How We Define Research

Our current research makes a significant contribution to achieving the SDGs. We have a range of research programmes, research groups and methods for sharing academic research that delivers on the SDGs. For example, our work with the Institute for Social Justice involves researching social justice in the context of overtourism in the City of York, in collaboration with the charity The Good Organisation. Our research groups, such as the Visitor Experience and Economy Research Group, engage with a diverse range of projects that tackle issues ranging from the climate crisis and pandemics to social mobility, social and environmental justice, and overtourism. Our research engages in theoretical and empirical programmes to advance our understanding of the role, dynamics, and impact of businesses across all sectors delivering sustainable social, environmental and economic value. For example, in the 2021 United Kingdom Research Excellence Framework assessment, York Business School submitted two impact case studies that significantly contributed to addressing wider societal challenges.



The York Business School has been recognised nationally for its outstanding educational achievements, having been nominated for Business School of the Year by Times Higher Education in 2024. The York Business School purposefully engages with managers of business corporations to enhance the knowledge of our students, sharing their challenges in meeting social and environmental responsibilities. We aim to facilitate collaboration between students and businesses in building solutions that address these challenges. CMI accreditation allows undergraduate and postgraduate students to gain professional accreditation from the CMI alongside their degrees.

How We Define Share

We share our successes and failures to enable collective learning and best live our common values and purpose. The York Business School is committed to sharing its performance on policies related to responsible management education, including its successes and areas for improvement. Our performance is published nationally through the National Student Survey, which expresses the views of our students past and present. The postgraduate student survey (PRES) and staff survey complement this. These results inform our approach to responsible business management education. The University has established key performance indicators to be improved by 2026. Those relevant to PRME include: • Enable positive access, awarding and progression outcomes for all students in line with our Access and Participation Plan 2020-2025 • Eliminate the gender pay gap (GPG) and Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic pay gap (2026 staging targets: 5% mean and median GPG, retain zero pay gap for Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic staff) • Diverse student population of 10,000, including undergraduates, postgraduates (including research students) and degree apprentices • In the top quartile of all HE institutions for the national learning and teaching measure • Meet the Office for Students standard for graduate and managerial level employment outcomes each year • 90% overall satisfaction in national student satisfaction measures • 90% of staff are proud to work at the University • 50% of our electricity supply will be supplied directly from carbon-free sources
