Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

Teaching Voices

Dr. Mohammed Alkhaldi: "My teaching approach centers on integrating health-related SDGs—specifically Goals 1, 3, 5, 6, 13, and 17—into the curriculum. This integration is supported by evidence-based examples, case studies, empirical research, policy reports, and real-world testimonies, bridging the gap between theory and practice. The courses I teach, including Global Health, Public Health Ethics, Health Systems, and Health Policy and Governance, are meticulously designed to align with these SDGs. Each course embeds SDG-related themes within its content, ensuring that students understand the interconnectedness of health and sustainable development. This approach is achieved by integrating recent global and social issues, frameworks, and tools into the curriculum; facilitating collective and individual policy dialogues and presentations; organizing mini-class poster exhibitions; assigning policy analysis writing tasks; conducting field visits to health system organizations; promoting group work to develop collaborative plans and procedures; and engaging students in collaborative and multidisciplinary publications and networks focusing on global health issues related to SDGs. This effective approach not only enhances students' understanding of health-related SDGs but also equips them with the necessary skills/competencies to contribute effectively to sustainable health solutions".

SafeSeat, developed by business students Romell Surti, Hanna Gajol, Ayesha Jumani, Rachelle Hombria, and Ziad Akiki, is a portable applicator containing biodegradable plastic seat covers designed to protect users from bacteria on public toilet seats. "Our product is a durable applicator with 50 biodegradable covers that dissolve upon flushing. It's sustainable, cost-effective, and reduces direct contact with bacteria," explained Hombria. The team's project stood out for its practicality and environmental consciousness. Unlike traditional covers, SafeSeat features a hook for hygienic application and avoids chemicals that might cause allergies.
