The Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) is a United Nations-supported initiative founded in 2007 that aims to raise the profile of sustainability in their classrooms through Seven Principles focused on serving society and safeguarding our planet.

PRME engages business and management schools to ensure they provide future leaders with the skills needed to balance economic and sustainability goals, while drawing attention to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and aligning academic institutions with the work of the UN Global Compact. Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

In September 2015, all 193 Member States of the United Nations adopted a plan for achieving a better future for all – laying out a path over the next 15 years to end extreme poverty, fight inequality and injustice, and protect our planet. At the heart of Agenda 2030 are 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and 169 related targets that address the most important economic, social, environmental and governance challenges of our time. The SDGs clearly define the world we want – applying to all nations and leaving no one behind. Successful implementation of the SDGs will require all players to champion this agenda; the role of higher education is critical to this.

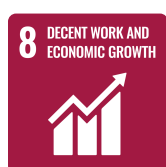
Courses that support RME

Faculty of Business and Law, Curtin University reports 1 course in 2025 that support responsible management education and sustainable development goals.

MGMT2004 Business and Sustainable Development | MGMT2004

This unit focuses on the principles and practices of regenerative business, going beyond the concept of sustainability to explore how businesses can become forces for positive change. Students will gain an understanding of regenerative business by examining the principles, strategies, and tools used to create systems that restore and regenerate ecosystems, minimise waste, and promote positive impacts on the environment, society, and the economy. By embracing a holistic approach underpinned through systems thinking, students learn how businesses can shift their focus from growth and profit to emphasising resilience, abundance and regeneration.

Our undergraduate students learn about the relevance and importance of sustainability in today's changing business environment. With changing environmental rules and regulations, demand from consumers and investors for more sustainable products and operation, and declining supply of natural capital, students learn how business must strategize to maintain its survival and growth in the future. Originating as a successful national initiative, the tax clinic model has now evolved through the Industry and Community Hub, which broadens its scope to include multiple disciplines. The hub is dedicated to enhancing community access to essential services while providing an alternative pathway for work-integrated learning (WIL) for students facing barriers to traditional placements. The hub develops professional skills such as ethical judgement, communication and resilience with students acting as employees supervised by registered practitioners.

Dr Yvonne Breitwieser-Faria gains widespread attention for Conversation article

Dr Yvonne Breitwieser-Faria received widespread attention for her recent article published in [The Conversation](#), titled *"In a world first, The Hague wants to arrest Taliban leaders over their treatment of women – what happens next?"*.

Published on 21 July 2025, the article was the fifth most read on *The Conversation* that month, placing Dr Breitwieser-Faria among the Top Five authors for July. It was also selected for republication in [The Conversation France](#), reflecting the global relevance and impact of her work.

The article led to five radio interviews and significant public engagement. In the article, Dr Breitwieser-Faria explains the significance of the International Criminal Court's arrest warrants against senior Taliban leaders.
