phenomena, issues and situations associated with strategic entrepreneurship, even with limited information; demonstrate the ability to identify and formulate issues critically, independently and creatively as well as to plan and, using appropriate research methods, undertake advanced tasks within predetermined time frames so as to contribute to the development of knowledge and evaluate this work; demonstrate an ability in speech and writing to report clearly on strategic entrepreneurship issues and discuss their conclusions and the knowledge and arguments on which they are based, in dialogue with different national and international audiences; and demonstrate the skills required for participation in research and development work or to work independently in other advanced contexts, including in academic research related to strategic entrepreneurship. Judgement and Approach Graduates of the programme will understand the scientific, social, ethical, and personal responsibility aspects of practical work and research in business administration, including the role, use, and development of knowledge and the ethical aspects and possibilities of scientific endeavour. Corresponding objectives: Graduates of the programme will be able to demonstrate an ability to make assessments in business administration, taking into account relevant scientific, societal and ethical issues and also demonstrate awareness of ethical aspects in research and development work; demonstrate insight into the possibilities and limitations of science/research, its role in society and people's responsibility for how it is used; and demonstrate an ability to identify their personal need for further knowledge and to take responsibility for developing their knowledge. Mission driven goals Graduates of the programme will be equipped to contribute to the advancement of business practice in a global environment, with particular emphasis on aspects of Ownership, and/or Entrepreneurship and/or Renewal. Description of degree programs with RME in the program-level learning goals and assessment rubrics

Bachelor in Sustainable Enterprise Development is an example of a program that has RME in the course level learning goals.

The program meets the increasing need for leaders who initiate and manage change processes, both within for-profit and non-profit organizations. It is designed to promote an entrepreneurial mindset focused on sustainability and recovery. After graduation, you will be equipped to start and manage initiatives that support sustainability transformation of businesses or innovate existing practices to promote safe and fair businesses.

The challenges of climate change, biodiversity loss, clean water, renewable energy, global migration, and poverty and inequality create conditions that threaten the stability of the global economy and the health of the planet. As a graduate, you will be prepared to address these challenges, in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. You can also create opportunities to engage in interdisciplinary networks, support purpose-driven organizations or develop corporate cultures that prioritize internal development goals.

During your studies, you will interact with students from other cultures and be taught by a committed and international teaching team. This program includes course projects with organizations and field trips.

The program provides a solid foundation so that you can start your company or work in a position in general administration, as a business developer, project manager or sustainability manager.

We encourage novel research questions and profound empirical results and are particularly interested in research that is in line with MMTC's key focus areas:

2. Sustainability
3. Globalisation
4. Digital business and Innovation
5. Esports and Gaming

JIBS has taken some concrete actions to push in the direction of fully integrating RIA into the curricula. One example of this is the **Integrate Responsible in Action into your classroom project**. This challenge was designed to encourage and support teachers in innovating courses to align them with sustainability issues. As this process requires time and resources, a prize of SEK 3,000 was provided to 3 selected class activities to help them implement their ideas.

Description of the Signatory Member's pedagogical approach, which involves RME in all degree program design and pedagogical innovations

Science Park JIBS JTH Impact Challenge was run in September 2023, is also a great example of pedagogical approach for involving RME in degree programs design and pedagogical innovations.

Science Park JIBS JTH Impact Challenge was run in September 2023 where 250 students from JIBS and JTH(Engineering School)collaborated to envision different industries scenario, e.g: how can the future of finance, transportation, food, textile contribute to a sustainability transition? This challenge is designed as hackathon challenge where many ideas emerge, the best proposal is awarded 15.000kronor and Science Park supports the development of ideas and new start ups.

RME is in the signatory's educational vision, so that it drives the signatory's business model and all educational efforts, courses, programs, degrees, and non-degrees

Description of the business model with RME in all educational efforts

RME is in JIBS educational vision and JIBS is in process of including RIA principles in all programmes ILOs.

By 2024, JIBS aims to fully include RIA principles in all programmes' Intended Learning Outcomes (ILOs) (master's and bachelor's). To achieve this goal, Champion for Responsibility in Action Guénola Nonet and Associate Dean of Education have already started discussing how to revise the course syllabus to give more space and importance to sustainability for both students and teachers by 2024.

Knowledge Translation and Dissemination

Description of partnering activities that involve informing

Participation in NORD PLUS Symposium : Ulemiste City in 2022 and 2023. These kinds of partnerships present a platform for engaging external businesses and communities for extending RME.

The second meeting of the network took place in Ülemiste City from 5-7 October. This time the focus was on the topic Challenges of Environmental Awareness in Future City. In the previous years, some of the topics of the meetings have been developing creative entrepreneurship, the opportunities and challenges of digitalisation and implementing on-the-job training in companies. 36 students and eight lecturers and scientists from eight universities participated in the meeting this time. Meetings between companies, students and lecturers, open lectures to share experiences and knowledge, business speed dating and the Green Diet conference took place during the three days of the network meeting.

The Ülemiste City Future Forum 2023 took place on 10-11 May. The conference focused on four forward-looking and inspiring key areas—future trends, innovation and data, discovering and developing talent in a healthy environment, and a green mindset as a new reality and business opportunity. These topics brought more than 50 top leaders from Europe to Ülemiste City. Faculty members, digital ambassadors and students attended the conference to learn and share about sustainability and business education.
