Deakin is one of Australia's leading tertiary education providers and amongst the top 1% of universities worldwide. As a young and vibrant university, Deakin has a huge focus on innovation and ideation which together has shaped the university and made a positive difference to its graduates and communities.


Deakin is a regional university headquartered in Geelong, Victoria, with campuses located in central Geelong (Waterfront), Waurn Ponds, Melbourne (Burwood), Warrnambool, and internationally at GIFT City in India and a new joint campus in Bandung, Indonesia in association with the University of Lancaster (UK) and Navitas. It also offers a vibrant online learning environment through its Cloud Campus, which provides flexible access to education for students across metropolitan, regional, rural, and offshore locations. Located in the heart of Gujarat International Finance TecCity (GIFT City), Deakin's GIFT City Campus is the first international branch campus in India.

Context/ History

Deakin began its journey in the mid-1970s, as a 'traditional' (on-campus) university and as a distance education provider with a commitment to access, equity and participation for those who could not otherwise access a metropolitan university. From that beginning, Deakin is recognised for providing innovative on- and off-campus business education across Australia. This progressive approach remains part of our 'DNA' today, driven by equity, access and equivalence. Deakin is recognised as a creator and innovator, developing ideas through exploration, testing and challenging, and translating and applying ideas to deliver impact. These foundations ensure that all faculties operate in an environment that embraces and promotes continuous improvement.

Within Deakin, Deakin Business School (DBS) is one of two Schools in the Faculty of Business and Law (FBL) at Deakin University. DBS is in the top 1% of business schools globally and one of only 150 schools worldwide to hold both AACSB and EQUIS accreditations. We are one of only 11 EQUIS-accredited business schools in Australia. DBS was re-accredited by AACSB for 5 years from January 2021 and EQUIS for five years from 2022. Deakin Business School has been recognised for its quality, reputation and career impact by being ranked in the top 5 business schools in the country.

DBS is a signatory to PRME since 2012. It has been termed as a PRME champion for the fourth time in 2024-25 cycle. DBS is also an associate member of GRLI and is strongly committed to the UN Sustainable development Goals (SDGs) as reflected in its mission and values.
