PRME engages business and management schools to ensure they provide future leaders with the skills needed to balance economic and sustainability goals, while drawing attention to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and aligning academic institutions with the work of the UN Global Compact. Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

On May 30, 2024, the University of Vaasa hosted a Science and Business for Sustainable Growth seminar to bring together decision-makers, businesses, and those working in science and research to discuss how to work together to support Ostrobothnia and Finland's success.

The seminar panellists explored strategies to promote collaboration between the university and businesses, increase the region's appeal, and take steps to keep international PhD students in the region after they finish their doctoral studies. The panel advised expanding university alumni activities to foster collaboration, forming networks, encouraging researchers and professors to establish research and innovation-based businesses, expanding collaborative development and research platforms, and improving researchers' working cultures.

Collaboration between research and business is critical for long-term growth and competitiveness.

The programme is intended to prepare students for professional roles in a variety of projects by emphasising technical needs, human-centered problem-solving abilities, and a strategic grasp of dynamic settings and systems.

Creating a carbon-neutral regional energy system

The PEAK project, led by the University of Vaasa and Aktion Österbotten, aims to create a carbon-neutral regional energy system in Ostrobothnia by incorporating renewable energy sources. The project's findings contribute to the rapid and active development of the energy system.

The broad review of the project will foster increased interaction among actors and establish a robust foundation for promoting and implementing new developments, thereby significantly accelerating positive changes in the region's energy system. The project's expected long-term impacts include a reduction in CO2 emissions, a gradual decarbonisation of the energy system, a positive shift in attitudes, and a growing interest in participating in the development of the

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regional energy system. Furthermore, we anticipate a smarter energy system and electricity grid, facilitating increased renewable energy capacity and fostering cooperation among various energy production stakeholders.
