As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

We are extremely impressed by the responsibility-related research being generated at Telfer. As can be seen in the following tables, Telfer faculty, instructors and graduate students have published 193 peer reviewed journals and 14 book chapters on topics related to the SDGs in the period since our last PRME SIP report (September 1, 2022 to August 31, 2024).

Our faculty have also been involved in SDG related research projects that have generated more than \$250K in internal grants and over \$23.5 million dollars in external funding from national funding agencies such as SSHRC (Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada) and CIHR (Canadian Institutes of Health Research) amongst others. This is remarkable success is made possible by an extensive network of research partners from across the globe.
