The Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) is a United Nations-supported initiative founded in 2007 that aims to raise the profile of sustainability in their classrooms through Seven Principles focused on serving society and safeguarding our planet.

PRME engages business and management schools to ensure they provide future leaders with the skills needed to balance economic and sustainability goals, while drawing attention to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and aligning academic institutions with the work of the UN Global Compact. Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

This commitment is not based on a wish to jump on the bandwagon to follow the crowd but a genuine desire to make the world a better place through future-oriented quality higher education. Our efforts to embed Responsible Management Education (RME) in the provision is to give our students the edge above the rest to become future leaders with a conscience and unshakable commitment to sustainable development, environmental protection, social responsibility and good governance.

In addition to the academic provision, we wish to engage our students and staff in practical activities designed to inculcate a sense of individual responsibility and build a habit of practice to become role models for others. All our academic programmes now incorporate RME-integrated and focused teaching and learning materials. There are dedicated Guest Lecturers on select RME topics for focused learning sessions. As a testimony to our efforts, we have even won a few awards in recognition of our dedication to creating and disseminating knowledge of responsible management and sustainable development, termed as a green intellectual product.

We continue to be encouraged by our stakeholders and inspired by the leadership of the PRME initiative and some of the institutions that have shown outstanding achievements and remarkable innovations in this space. Therefore, we intend to push ourselves to do more and be innovative in our efforts to become a PRME Champion.
