The Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) is a United Nations-supported initiative founded in 2007 that aims to raise the profile of sustainability in their classrooms through Seven Principles focused on serving society and safeguarding our planet.

PRME engages business and management schools to ensure they provide future leaders with the skills needed to balance economic and sustainability goals, while drawing attention to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and aligning academic institutions with the work of the UN Global Compact. Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

In September 2015, all 193 Member States of the United Nations adopted a plan for achieving a better future for all – laying out a path over the next 15 years to end extreme poverty, fight inequality and injustice, and protect our planet. At the heart of Agenda 2030 are 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and 169 related targets that address the most important economic, social, environmental and governance challenges of our time. The SDGs clearly define the world we want – applying to all nations and leaving no one behind. Successful implementation of the SDGs will require all players to champion this agenda; the role of higher education is critical to this.

Strathmore University's strategic priorities are closely aligned with advancing sustainable development, the common good, and quality education. Strathmore University has been a signatory to PRME and the UN Global Compact since 2017. The university has been actively represented in the PRME Chapter Africa Founding Committee in 2019/2020 and has been on the current steering committee between 2020 and 2025. Through this chapter, Strathmore contributes to shaping the African perspective within PRME's global network, emphasizing the continent's unique challenges and opportunities in sustainable development. The university also plays a visible role in PRME Chapter Africa's events, capacity-building workshops (e.g. i5), and joint research initiatives on sustainability and inclusive leadership in African business schools (i.e. Business Schools for Climate Leadership Africa).

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Definition of Purpose

At Strathmore University, our purpose in relation to Responsible Management Education (RME) is anchored in PRME's first principle: to develop students as future generators of sustainable value for business and society, working toward an inclusive and sustainable global economy. This commitment is embedded in our 2021–2025 Strategic Plan, which emphasizes a transformative student experience, academic excellence, service to society, and research and innovation. We seek to shape graduates who not only excel professionally but also place societal and ecological wellbeing at the heart of their leadership. Through initiatives such as service-based learning, curricula that emphasises ethical leadership, and sustainability leadership programmes, we strive to ensure our students are equipped with the values, knowledge, and capabilities to respond to Africa's pressing development challenges and global sustainability goals. A central pillar of this commitment is our Service to Society approach, which grounds students' academic journeys in community engagement and social impact. Yet, reflecting on this purpose, there are opportunities for improvement. While we have made progress in aligning our programmes and values to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), more can be done to embed RME consistently across all faculties and schools rather than concentrating sustainability learning in selected programmes. We also need to strengthen experiential learning by linking students more directly with industry and community partners to apply responsible management concepts to real-world challenges. Furthermore, our purpose can be made more tangible by integrating non-financial performance indicators—such as ESG standards, and social impact—into curricula, research, and institutional evaluation frameworks-particularly our reporting process.
