As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

Successful implementation of the SDGs will require all players to champion this agenda; the role of higher education is critical to this.

### a. Strategic Integration and Leadership

The school has systematically integrated the concept of sustainable development into its "3 + 1 Green Strategy" framework, which takes green research, green teaching and green social services as the three pillars and the Research Center of Low Carbon Economy for Guangzhou Region as the core driving platform. This strategy not only provides clear action guidance for teachers and students but also fosters a culture of responsible management, consolidating the School's thought leadership in sustainable development in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area.

### c. Key Practical Projects

The school's commitments are demonstrated through a series of projects focusing on real-world issues, showing how to systematically cultivate a new generation of responsible leaders.

### · Applied Research Empowering Industrial Transformation

Action: The Research Center of Low Carbon Economy for Guangzhou Region leads applied research with direct policy and industry relevance.

Achievements: Key outputs include the national association standard Carbon Emissions Accounting Guidelines for Maritime Transport Enterprises and the Research on the "Dual Carbon" Strategy jointly released with Guangdong Transportation Group.

Impact: It provides scientific tools for key industries to quantify and manage carbon footprints, strongly supports the transformation of the regional economy to a low-carbon model, and consolidates the school's role as an important knowledge partner for regional sustainable development.

### Experiential Learning Driving Social Innovation

Action: Through the X-Studio platform, students are guided to apply business knowledge to solve complex real-world problems.

Case: The Western Rural Revitalization Volunteer Team Project. Student teams integrated modern aesthetics with traditional Tibetan knitting techniques to provide design, training and market support for Tibetan housewives in Batang County, Sichuan Province.

Impact: This project not only empowered local women economically (SDG 8), helping them transform from unpaid houseworkers to income earners, but also significantly enhanced their self-worth and social status. It effectively promoted gender equality (SDG 5) in the community and formed a replicable social innovation model.
