As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

IU International University of Applied Sciences (IU) aligns its strategic priorities closely with the advancement of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), such as SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), SDG 13 (Climate Action), SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals), and others.

As a digitally native and inclusive education provider, IU offers affordable and flexible learning to over 140,000 students in more than 150 countries. Through this model, it directly supports SDG 4 by expanding global access to high quality higher education. Initiatives such as the Study Access Alliance and Women in Tech scholarships exemplify IU's commitment to SDG 5 and SDG 10, promoting gender equity and educational access for underrepresented groups.

Environmental sustainability is embedded in IU's operations and strategy. As a B Corp certified and PAS 2060 certified climate neutral institution, IU works actively toward SDG 13 by minimising emissions through online delivery, using renewable energy at its sites, and supporting global carbon offset projects. The institution's transparent ESG governance further reflects its alignment with SDG 17, as demonstrated by its membership in the UN Global Compact and public ESG reporting.


