Award Description:

The results of Yeung's recent publication (20 pcs - 2024/25 as of May, 2025) are in line with the UNESCO publication (2014) on Education for Sustainability (EfS), integration of the principles, values, and practices of sustainable development into the key aspects of education and learning. In fact, the results share the same vision of the declaration of UNESCO (1998) that more diversified categories of people, and of its contents, methods, practices and means of delivery, based on new types of links and partnerships with the community and with the broadest sectors of society are needed. Moreover, Yeung's recent paper for EcoHumanism Journal brings in significant contributions in developing a set of social inclusion quality indicators to assess quality performance of higher education institutions with blockchain content-based technology implementation into curriculum or administration. School management, academic and administrative staff members need to apply system thinking, humanistic thinking of teaching and learning, and proactively use of UNSDGs for increasing the level of performance in programme delivery, social responsibility and system performance. Hence, social inclusion quality indicators are the outputs of comparing international standards and blockchain related documents for sustainable development.

Forward Thinking in Sustainable Development Education with Disruptions

The Classroom as Climate Lab: Reinventing Economic Incentives

Dr. Yeung's work at Gratia Christian College speaks volumes about her pioneering approach. As head of the School of Business, she isn't just teaching sustainability; she's flipping the script on how we think about it. Her "pay for recovery" framework—which connects tax rebates and subsidies to

measurable waste reduction—is already making waves in Hong Kong. One retail pilot using this model has already resulted in a 37% reduction in single-use plastics— echoing the very objectives of COP 30 and that Brazil's proposed Tropical Forest Finance Facility (TFFF) hopes to achieve. Yeung's approach ties fiscal incentives to responsible business practices, and it offers a sustainable model that not only helps businesses but also provides a path for countries to incentivize their sustainability commitments on a global scale.

When Dr. Yeung explains her model, she does so with infectious optimism: "We're flipping the script on sustainability costs. This isn't just about environmental ethics—this is about transforming how we do business." And transform she has. In collaboration with Genesis One Limited, Dr. Yeung is bringing sustainability to life through her innovative use of Chinese painting techniques on apparel. She has also adopted a pre-order sales approach, incorporating demand management concepts to prevent overproduction. Dr. Yeung's future goal is to embed QR codes in these garments, linking to sustainability education and turning everyday products into "wearable classrooms." This initiative offers a new way for consumers to learn about SDG 12. In one pilot, user sustainability literacy increased by 48%. It's this intersection of education and innovation that makes Dr. Yeung's work so transformative.
