The Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) is a United Nations-supported initiative founded in 2007 that aims to raise the profile of sustainability in their classrooms through Seven Principles focused on serving society and safeguarding our planet.

PRME engages business and management schools to ensure they provide future leaders with the skills needed to balance economic and sustainability goals, while drawing attention to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and aligning academic institutions with the work of the UN Global Compact. Driven by its mission to transform management education, PRME equips today's business students with the understanding and ability to deliver change tomorrow. As a voluntary initiative with over 800 signatories worldwide, PRME has become the largest organized relationship between the United Nations and management-related higher education institutions.

- ❖ Budgetary limitations
- ❖ Change fatigue
- ❖ Faculty expertise gaps
- ❖ Time constraints
- ❖ The main barriers to curricular innovation at UniSENAI PR include budgetary constraints, gaps in faculty expertise, time limitations, and challenges in resource allocation. In addition, there is a constant effort to align the curriculum with real industry demands and megatrends such as ESG, the SDGs, and emerging technologies. Integration across courses and campuses also represents a challenge, requiring continuous coordination and adaptation.

Barriers to Innovative Pedagogy

In 2024, National Service for Industrial Training – Senai/PR identified the following barriers to innovating, updating, or taking risks in existing pedagogy:

- ❖ Budget constraints
- ❖ Faculty confidence gaps
- ❖ Limited faculty development opportunities
- ❖ Overloaded faculty
- ❖ From a pedagogical perspective, innovation is impacted by budget constraints, gaps in faculty confidence and training, workload pressures, and technological limitations. Faculty need to adapt their practices to incorporate the methodology and align teaching with industry demands, ESG, and the SDGs. Coordination between courses and campuses, as well as adaptation to megatrends, also represent significant barriers to the implementation of innovative pedagogies.



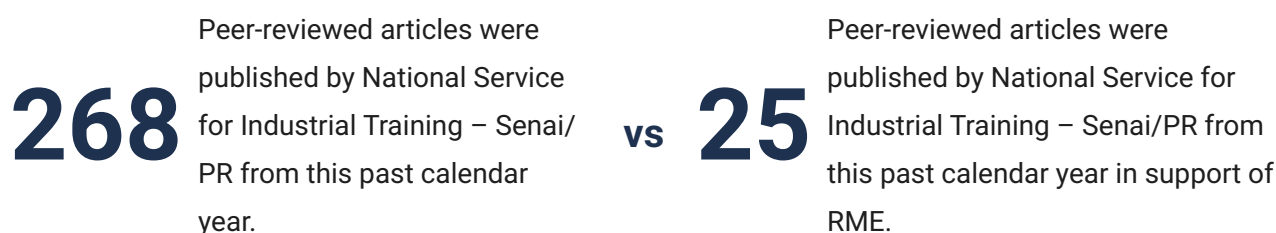
